Interstate Business Park receives AdvantageSite Re-designation

PRATTVILLE, AL., – Interstate Business Park in Autauga County has received an AdvantageSite Re-designation from the Economic Development Partnership of Alabama.

The AdvantageSite program requires that community economic development organizations provide documentation specific to a proposed industrial site, including a set of standard data related to ownership/control, environmental and geotechnical conditions, and infrastructure status. Sites must also meet size, zoning and accessibility requirements.

“Achieving AdvantageSite status guarantees our continued economic development success by highlighting what we have to offer in our community,” said Amy Brabham, Economic Development Director of the Prattville Area Chamber of Commerce.

Interstate Business Park joins a growing inventory of quality sites that have earned the AdvantageSite designation and re-designations,” said Greg Blalock, Project Director of the Building and Site database for EDPA. “These sites are being actively marketed on the web-based Alabama Buildings and Sites database, which averages 630 daily searches.”

The park, which has 28 available acres, is located along Highway 31 and is also the home of the Central Alabama Electric Cooperative Headquarters in Autauga County.

The AdvantageSite program is jointly sponsored by the Alabama Department of Commerce, Spire, Alabama Power Company, EDPA, the North Alabama Industrial Development Association and PowerSouth Energy Cooperative. This voluntary industrial site preparedness program was created in order to make the state more competitive for companies considering a location in Alabama.

“It requires a lot of public infrastructure to get an industrial park ready,” stated Jay Thompson, Autauga County Commission Chair. “This re-designation proves once again, that we’ve paved the way for industry and jobs to come to Autauga County, and we are Open for Business and Industry.”
